Pub Ed Report for the July 10th Ilwaco Hook & Ladder Company meeting

June Activities:

June 15th was the first Saturday Market for us. Sparky made an appearance for the OBH Heart Walk and helped participants with their stretching and the kick-off of the walk.

Market day was slow but we talked to those who came by about the upcoming Car Seat Event and answered many questions about fire extinguishers.

June 22nd was our very first Car Seat Check event! Thank you to Michelle & Meg two of our CPS Technicians and to Chris and John who volunteered to help with traffic and child entertaining! We also had Lani from PCFD1 who came and helped as a CPST and Wanda who is the Lead CPST Instructor for the State of Washington (she was Michelle & I's instructor for our class)

The event was slow we ended up doing 5 car seat checks and we gave away 3 car seats during the event. Wanda gave us great feedback and loved how we had the event set up. She assured us that it was normal to not have a huge turnout for the event and that in fact the first few may be just like this. She said as the community learns of this and the information gets out the events will grow. She had nothing but nice things to say about our station and was excited about all the community prevention education we were working on.

We are looking at having 1 car seat event per quarter and working with PCFD 1 on other future events.

June 29th Saturday Market we focused on fire extinguisher education. We had a lot of fun showing both adults and kids how fire extinguishers work and allowing them to put their hands on one and see how it feels in action. It was a busy day at the market and we had 2 address sign sign-ups and referred to address signs to PCFD 1 as the people lived in Ocean Park. Lots of kids came by and learned about STOP DROP & ROLL.

I have also been working on writing a grant for more CPS materials to help our events go more smoothly and additional tools that were suggested by Wanda. It is a \$4000 grant that is due in August and we will know if we are awarded the grant in October.

Also, we are working on holding a CPST class here at our station in the Spring and I am also applying for a grant to cover those costs as well.

I have attended the WA State Department of Health Injury & Violence Prevention/ Falls Prevention Technical Advisory Committee to listen and learn about opportunities for grants or programs we can offer our community to help.

I met with Rachel Cassidy, she is the Community Outreach Manager for OBH and we will be working together on a few future projects together. We will also be having a booth along with Sparky being at the OBH Health Fair in September.

So far this month we have had two car seat appointments scheduled and another address post-ordered. We participated in the Ocean Park 4th of July Parade with Sparky, Murf, E3321, M3342 and the Prowler. It was a lot of fun and Sparky and Murf were a huge hit with the crowd!

On Saturday the 6th Sparky was up early and showed up to cheer on the runners for the Firecracker 5K and gave a lot of high 5's ! Later that day Sparky then went to the Port of Ilwaco before the Firework Display and handed out stickers, high 5's and a lot of hugs!

On Monday, July 8th I met with Hailey Falley the Region 2 manager for Target Zero. Target Zero is the WA State Department of Transportation division's goal is to reduce traffic fatalities and serious injuries on WA roadways. The Child Passenger Safety program falls under this. Hailey and I discussed many of the outreach, education, and prevention activities that the Ilwaco Fire Department is working on. Together we will be looking for more grants and funding opportunities to help with what we are working on here. I was asked to be a part of the Target Zero Task Force for Region 2 and I will have my first meeting on the 16th.

While Hailey was here, she got to see Ilwaco's community effort when a family from Germany stopped by the station and we were able to give them a station tour and a ride in the fire truck. Myself, John and Eli all jumped in to interact with the family. The father was a firefighter in Germany and couldn't believe the time we took to give his family the tour.

Hailey was so impressed with our spirit and commitment to sharing what we enjoy and our passion for our station. She is looking forward to working with us and can't wait to hold classes down here. She is very excited to see all the work that is happening in our community and where we will take it.
